## Important Reminders:

When dropping off and picking up children you MUST have a mask on. There are two designated spots in the foyer for families to stand and maintain 6 feet in distance. There cannot be more than two families in the foyer area at a time, so if the two spots are filled when you arrive, please wait outside until there is an open spot. When dropping off/ picking up use the intercom or message on the appropriate GroupMe thread notifying us your child is here. A designated staff member will come get your child at the door to check their temperature and allow them to wash their hands before entering or exiting their classroom.





## Curriculum Overview:

**October**: Our focus this month will be on buildings and light. We are going to be taking these back to the basics as we discuss what a building is made out of and what is considered a light. As the kiddos really dig into the Reggio approach with these subjects we will tie them into day to day lives.
